NEXT MEETING: November 16, 2020

The meeting of the Board of Directors of the Washington Township Hospital CALL Development Corporation was held on May 18, 2020 via Teleconference in order TO to comply with Governor Gavin Newsom's and Alameda County's mandatory ORDER orders to Shelter at Home to reduce the risk of spread of COVID-19. Chairman Sah called the meeting to order at 7:30a.m.

A motion was made by Director Blowers, seconded by Director Fuerniss to approve the minutes of the meeting of January 29, 2020. The motion was carried by the following vote.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF January 29, 2020

Ms. Hartz noted that there was no written or oral communication.

COMMUNICATIONS

Ms. Hartz provided information regarding the current spread of the novel PRESIDENT & CHIEF coronavirus. This is an evolving situation and the administration and physicians EXECUTIVE OFFICER are working on initiatives to ensure the continued safety of the staff, doctors and REPORT the community. Due to the pandemic, a current shelter in place order has been put into effect by Alameda County. During the shelter in place order, elective and non-urgent surgeries have been on hold. A stable supply of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is being maintained and inventory is monitored on a daily basis. Maintaining the stable supply of PPE is a continued effort and challenge. COVID-19 testing is provided both through the hospital lab as well as through Stanford reference lab. The hospital is on limited allocation of reagents to perform all the testing in-house. To date, we have administered 2,341 COVID-19 tests and 350 antibody tests. Within the hospital, screening is taking place at all entrances for the continued safety of the patients, staff and visitors. This consists of a temperature check, standard questions and distribution of a mask that is required to be worn. No visitors are allowed in the hospital at this time except for limited situations.

A phased approach will be followed when restarting elective cases and non-

urgent surgical procedures. Patients will be required to be tested for COVID-19 prior to surgical procedures. All suspect COVID-19 patients will be treated as if EXECUTIVE OFFICER they are positive until test results conclude otherwise.

PRESIDENT & CHIEF REPORT (CONT'D)

Volume has decreased during this time due to elective and non-urgent surgical cases being on hold and also because patients have chosen to delay their care during the pandemic due to the shelter in place order and personal safety concerns. Signage and posters have been distributed to encourage the community that it is safe to receive care at this time. Telemedicine appointments are also available. In an effort to provide continued COVID-19 education, the hospital also has a resource link located on the Washington Hospital Healthcare System internet site.

Chris Henry, Vice President and Chief Financial Officer, shared information regarding financial funding that is available as a result of COVID-19. The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act is a federally funded program that provides financial support to healthcare providers that have been affected financially due to the COVID-19 pandemic. These relief payments are forgivable and must be used for healthcare-related expenses. DEVCO did not qualify for this funding. Also, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) have a program to provide accelerated payments when there is a disruption in claims submission, or processing, during the period of a public health emergency. The accelerated payments are required to be repaid.

Ms. Nunez noted that Washington Township Hospital Development Corporation (DEVCO) and Washington Township Medical Foundation (WTMF) are both developing safety initiatives for patients and staff to ensure social distancing as part of the reopening strategy for the sites.

Ms. Hartz announced that Dr. Stephen Catalya, MD, Infectious Disease, has been offered an employment agreement with Washington Township Medical Foundation. He is anticipated to start on August 31, 2020. Dr. Catalya received his Bachelor of Science in Combined Sciences from Santa Clara University. He received his Doctor of Medicine at Saint George's University School of Medicine and completed his residency at Hackensack Meridian Health in New Jersey. He is fluent in Spanish and is a member of the American Medical Student Association, the American College of Physicians, and the American Academy of Family Physicians. It was noted that Dr. Muni Barash will be transitioning to part time and providing primary care only to patients.

Ms. Hartz informed the group that the property for the Warm Springs project was purchased in March and is currently in the planning stages for future development, which will take the next fiscal year to complete after which construction will begin for the site. This property is owned jointly between the Washington Township Health Care District (WTHCD) and the University of California San Francisco (UCSF). 51% of ownership will be held by the District and the

remaining 49% will be held by UCSF.

In accordance with Sections 1461, 1462, 32106 and 32155 of the California Health & Safety Code and Sections 54962 and 54954.5 of the California Government Code, Chairman Sah adjourned the meeting to closed session at 8:20a.m.

The units have been serviced multiple times and due to the age of the equipment, parts are difficult to find. This item was included in the Capital budget for FY 2019/20.

Budget Estimate FY 2020/21

The Budget Estimate for FY 2020/21 for the Washington Township Hospital Development Corporation (DEVCO) is being presented to the Board of Directors of the Development Corporation for its adoption.

In the latter part of Fiscal Year 2019/20, DEVCO began operating in unprecedented times with the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. In mid-March, Governor Gavin Newsom declared a State of Emergency and Alameda County issued a "shelter-in-place" order. This order necessitated some of the DEVCO sites to limit operations or altogether close for a period of time. Reopening of the sites has now occurred however, volume in most of the sites is not back to pre-COVID levels as many patients are delaying their primary and specialty care for fear of contracting the virus.

This budget reflects a projection in a period of great uncertainty as the country continues to fight this pandemic. Experts warn that the recovery pace for health care providers will be slow and that "normal" volume will not come back quickly. It may be some time before we establish what a new "normal" will look like. Therefore, the volume assumptions for each unit take this into account.

This budget takes into account inflation, contracted changes, staffing changes, operating changes and the impact of COVID-19. For the FY 2020/21, the Washington Township Hospital Development Corporation is budgeted as follows:

Visits are budgeted at 38,095

Total Operating Revenue is budgeted at \$33,898,009

Total Expenses are budgeted at \$34,120,385

Net Income is budgeted at (\$1,301,690)

In accordance with District Law, Policies and Procedures, I request that the Washington Township Hospital Development Corporation Board of Directors authorize the President and Chief Executive Officer to proceed with the adoption of the Washington Township Hospital Development Corporation FY 2020/21 Budget Estimate.

SUBJECT: WTMF Budget Estimate FY 2020/21

The Budget Estimate for FY 2020/21 for the Washington Township Medical Foundation (WTMF) is being presented for recommendation of adoption to the Board of Directors of the Development Corporation.

This budget takes into account inflation, contracted changes, staffing changes, budgetary changes, market growth and the impact of COVID-19.

For the FY 2020/21, Washington Township Medical Foundation is budgeted as follows:

Visits are budgeted at 194,356
Total Operating Revenue is budgeted at \$46,005,956
Total Expenses are budgeted at \$69,238,777
Net Loss is budgeted at (\$23,232,821)
Total Capital Budget of \$136,584

This budget was prepared during a period of great uncertainty created by the COVID-19 pandemic. In March of this year, the health care industry changed. Due to the outbreak of COVID-19, the Governor of California declared a State of Emergency. This declaration prompted Alameda County to issue a "shelter in place" order. Healthcare Systems within the County, including Washington Hospital, cancelled all elective and non-urgent services.

The "shelter in place" order impacted WTMF's operations and financial performance significantly. Patient clinic visits and surgeries had to be cancelled and postponed unless urgent. New protocols and workflows were implemented to address social distancing and safety measures related to the pandemic. A telehealth platform was developed so that patients and providers could still safely connect with each other. Additional personal protective equipment (PPE) needed to be acquired to protect our staff, physicians and patients. In May, as the "shelter in place" orders were slowly loosened, new workflows were established to accommodate social distancing. In addition, a marketing campaign was implemented to educate patients on the precautionary measures we had taken to make their visit to the clinic safe.

These times have brought historic financial pressures across our industry. Experts warn that volumes will not come back quickly. This budget reflects the ability of each provider and clinic to adapt to the reopening and recovery phase. We do not expect to get back to normal across all of our clinics in this fiscal year. Despite all of the challenges we have had to adapt to, we have developed a spending plan for WTMF that addresses the needs created by the pandemic, while also focusing on the continued growth of the organization. We also acknowledge that the situation we currently face continues to evolve and this may require us in the future to amend our estimates during the course of the fiscal year.

Washington Township Medical Foundation is helping to better position Washington Hospital Healthcare System and physicians for the rapidly changing health care landscape at both the state and federal levels along with an environment driven by great uncertainty. Washington Township Medical Foundation provides opportunities for care coordination and collaboration that is important to the current and future success of Washington Hospital Healthcare System. WTMF also creates a vehicle that allows us to continue to successfully recruit primary care and specialist physicians to our community and offers community physicians another option for practicing medicine so that the health care needs of the community can be met now and into the future.

Our continued commitment to Washington Township Medical Foundation provides an important strategic initiative in helping us meet our goal of providing local access to safe, quality care along with improving and maintaining the health status of the residents of our District. I am recommending that the Board of Directors of the Washington Township Hospital Development Corporation approve the FY 2020/21 WTMF Budget Estimate.
