COMMUNICATIONS: WRITTEN FINANCE REPORT

Chris Henry, Vice President & Chief Financial Officer, presented the Finance Report for February 2020. The average daily census was 163.1 with admissions of 911 resulting in 4,731 patient days. Outpatient observation equivalent days were 208. The average length of stay was 4.96 days. The case mix index was 1.490. Deliveries were 112. Surgical cases were 375. Joint Replacement cases were 167. Neurosurgical cases were 20. Cardiac Surgical cases were 13. The Outpatient visits were 7,729 and Emergency visits were 4,482. Total productive FTEs were 1,492.9. FTEs per adjusted occupied bed were 6.08.

HOSPITAL OPERATIONS REPORT

Kimberly Hartz presented the Hospital Operations Report for March 2020. It was noted that stoppage in elective surgeries due to COVID-19 went into effect March 17. Focus within the Hospital was on preparation for surge in positive COVID admissions. Preliminary information for March indicated gross revenue for the month at approximately \$152,200,000. The Average Length of Stay was 5.65 and there were 4,301 patient days. There were 278 Surgical Cases and 213 Cath Lab procedures at the Hospital. Deliveries were 120. Non-Emergency Outpatient visits were 5,288. Total FTEs per Adjusted Occupied Bed were 7.66. The Washington Outpatient Surgery Center had 328 cases and the clinics saw approximately 2,812 patients. Total Government Sponsored Preliminary Payor Mix was 71,3%, against the budget of 72.1%. Homeless Patient Total Encounters were 161 with an estimated unreimbursed cost of homeless care of \$304,000 for the month of March.

Kimberly Hartz talked about the Hospital's COVID-19 preparations for surge and the communications/education to the community through social media and the hospital webpage.

RESOLUTION NO. 1209

RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP HEALTH CARE DISTRICT OF ALAMEDA COUNTY, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, CALLING A DISTRICT GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP HEALTH CARE DISTRICT ON NOVEMBER 3, 2020

WHEREAS, Section 32100 of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California provides that the elective officers of a local health care district shall be a board of directors consisting of five (5) members, each of whom shall be a registered voter residing in the District and whose term shall be four (4) years;

WHEREAS, the term of two Directors, out of the existing Directors, shall expire at noon on the first Friday of December of 2020;

WHEREAS, Section 32100.5 of the Health and Safety Code provides that an election, which shall be known as the Health Care District General Election, shall be held in each local health care district on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even-numbered year, at which a successor shall be chosen for each officer whose term shall expire;

WHEREAS, the Washington Township Health Care District General Election shall be consolidated with the statewide General Election pursuant to Part 3 of Division 10 (commencing with Section 10400) of the Elections Code, and the person receiving the highest number of votes for each office to be filled at such election shall be elected hereto; and

WHEREAS, the term of office of each of the two (2) persons elected to fill those terms expiring at noon on the first Friday of December 2020 shall be four (4) years or until his or her successor is elected and has qualified.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

1. That in accordance with the provision of Section 32100 and 32100.5 of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California, a Health Care District General Election be and the same hereby is called and the same shall be held in said Washington Township Health Care District of Alameda County, State of California, on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, from the hour of 7:00 o'clock a.m., of said day until the hour of 8:00 o'clock p.m., of said day during which period of time electors of the said Washington Township Health Care District may vote for the successor of each of the two (2) members of the Board of Directors of Washington Township Health Care District of Alameda County, State of California, whose terms are about to expire, to serve for terms of four (4) years;

- 2. That all registered voters residing within Washington Township Health Care District of Alameda County, State of California, are qualified electors at said election, and the manner of voting, the form of ballot to be used, and in all other particulars said Health Care District General Election shall be held in accordance with the General Election laws of the State of California; and
- 3. Not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of said Health Care District General Election, the Board of Directors of said District, shall by resolution entered on its minutes, designate the precincts into which said District shall be divided for the conduct of said Health Care District General Election, and the polling place for each precinct and shall appoint for each precinct an election board consisting of at least one inspector, one Judge, and two (2) clerks, selected from the electors of said District, and shall provide for the giving of notice of said election pursuant to law.

RESOLUTION ORDERING THE CONSOLIDATION OF THE HEALTH CARE DISTRICT GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP HEALTH CARE DISTRICT OF ALAMEDA COUNTY, STATE OF CALIFORNIA ON NOVEMBER 3, 2020, WITH THE STATEWIDE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 3, 2020, AND REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF ALAMEDA TO CONSOLIDATE SAID HEALTH CARE DISTRICT GENERAL ELECTION WITH SAID STATEWIDE GENERAL ELECTION, INSOFAR AS THE TERRITORY IN WHICH SAID ELECTIONS ARE TO BE HELD IS THE SAME

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of Washington Township Health Care District is the governing body of the Washington Township Health Care District of Alameda County, State of California, and has called a Health Care District General Election to be held in said District on November 3, 2020, for the purpose of choosing a successor of each of the two (2) members of the Board of Directors whose terms are about to expire:

WHEREAS, Washington Township Health Care District of Alameda County is situated entirely within the boundaries of Washington Township, Alameda County, State of California; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that said Health Care District General Election be consolidated with the statewide General Election to be held on November 3, 2020, insofar as the same shall be held in the same territory.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Board of Directors of Washington Township Health Care District of Alameda County, State of California, as follows:

- 1. That the Health Care District General Election called and to be held on November 3, 2020, in said Washington Township Health Care District of Alameda County, shall be and the same is hereby consolidated with the statewide General Election to be held on said date throughout the State of California, insofar as the territory in which said elections are to be held is the same, to wit: within the boundaries of Washington Township, Alameda County, California;
- 2. That the Board of Supervisors of the County of Alameda is requested to consolidate said Health Care District General Election to be held on November 3, 2020 in said Washington Township Health Care District of Alameda County for the purpose of choosing a successor for each of the two (2) members of the Board of Health Care Directors whose terms

are about to expire on the first Friday of December 2020 with the statewide General Election to be held on November 3, 2020 insofar as the territory with the County of Alameda is the same as the territory within the boundaries of said Washington Township Health Care District of Alameda County, to wit: within the boundaries of Washington Township, Alameda County, State of California, and that the territory affected by this order of consolidation, the election precincts, polling places, and voting booths, shall in every case be the same as those established and provided for said statewide General Election and that the election officers in each precinct shall in every case be the same, to wit: the election officers to be appointed by said Board of Supervisors and that there shall be only one set of election officers in each polling place and that all proceedings held in the premises shall be recorded in one set of election papers and that the election shall be held in all respects as though there were only one election within said territory affected by such order of consolidation, and that the names of the persons proposed by petition as candidates for each of said offices of members of the Board of Directors of said Health Care District be set forth on the ballots for said statewide General Election in substantially the following form:

(WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP HEALTH CARE DISTRICT) (BOARD OF DIRECTORS: FOUR-YEAR TERM, VOTE FOR TWO)

- 3. That said Board of Supervisors of the County of Alameda is authorized and requested to cause the canvass of the returns of said Washington Township Health Care District General Election and to direct the Registrar of Voters to certify said results of said General Election of this Board of Directors of Washington Township Health Care District of Alameda County when such results have been ascertained;
- 4. That any candidate filing a candidate's statement of qualifications pursuant to Section 13307 of the California Elections Code shall pay the actual prorated costs of printing and handling said candidate's statement as provided therein. Said candidate's statement shall contain no more than 400 words. Candidates will not be permitted to submit other materials to be sent with the sample ballot and voter's pamphlet; and

5. That the Secretary of this Board of Directors is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Board of Supervisors of the County of Alameda.



Comparison of March acute inpatient statistics to those of the budget showed a lower level of admissions and a lower level of patient days. The average length of stay (ALOS) based on discharged days was above budget. Outpatient visits were lower than budget. Emergency Room visits were below budget for the month.

2. Staffing - Schedule Board 3

Total paid FTEs were 3.6 below budget. Total productive FTEs for March were 1,382.1, 4.1 below the budgeted level of 1,386.2. Nonproductive FTEs were 0.5 above budget. Productive FTEs per adjusted occupied bed were 6.95, 1.7 above the budgeted level of 5.25. Total FTEs per adjusted occupied bed were 7.66, 1.88 above the budgeted level of 5.78.

3. Income - Schedule Board 1

For the month of March the Hospital realized a loss of \$3,807,000 from operations.

Total Gross Patient Service Revenue of \$152,201,000 for March was 18.6% below budget.

Deductions from Revenue of \$117,251,000 represented 77.04% of Total Gross Patient Service Revenue. This percentage is below the budgeted amount of 77.72%, primarily due to payor mix.

Total Operating Revenue of \$35,376,000 was \$6,799,000 (16.1%) below the budget.

Total Operating Expense of \$39,183,000 was \$2,770,000 (6.6%) below the budgeted amount.

The Total Non-Operating Income of \$138,000 for the month includes an unrealized loss on investments of \$49,000 and property tax revenue of \$1,417,000.

The Total Net Loss for March was \$3,669,000, which was \$3,950,000 less than the budgeted income of \$281,000.

The Total Net Loss for March using FASB accounting principles, in which the unrealized loss or income on investments, net interest expense on GO bonds and property tax revenues are removed from the non-operating income and expense, was \$3,902,000 compared to budgeted income of \$53,000.

4. Balance Sheet - Schedule Board 2

The new balance sheet item, "Other Investments" reflects the Hospital's share (\$11,439,000) of the investment in the Warm Springs joint venture with UCSF. The Warm Springs building purchase was finalized in March.

There were no other noteworthy changes in assets and liabilities when compared to February 2020.


